Learning Philosophy

Fusion's learning philosophy is Love, Motivate, Teach. This thoughtfully designed model is mastery-based and emphasizes deep understanding over seat time, allowing students to progress only after demonstrating proficiency in course standards through personalized instruction and individual pacing. Through our balanced one-to-one teaching and mentoring approach, teachers spend time getting to know each student and design a learning experience based on the student's strengths, interests, and goals. Teachers see each student as an individual capable of succeeding and when a student feels safe and cared for, they are more engaged in the learning process.

Academic Program & Rigor

Fusion Academy provides individualized, college-preparatory instruction in a one-to-one format. Students' progress through personalized academic pathways that may include Honors, AP®, advanced electives, independent study, and accelerated sequencing. Academic rigor is evaluated through course selection, demonstrated progression, mastery, and depth within the context of each student's customized program.

Fusion Course Levels

Essential: Designed for students who need a more modified course. Flexibility with depth of content and rigor. No designation on the transcript.

College Prep: Prepares students to matriculate to a four-year college/university. Designated on the transcript as (P).

Honors: Honors courses provide more challenge than our College Prep courses. Designated on the transcript as (H), they are weighted an additional .5 of a point within our GPA calculations. Students typically engage in Honors courses in 11th and 12th grades.

AP®: AP® courses are the most rigorous in our catalog, receive an additional 1.0 point within our GPA calculation, and are designated on the transcript as (AP). In-person course opportunities vary across campuses. Fusion Academy Palm Beach Gardens does not offer AP® courses in person. Students may pursue online courses (1-to-1 or self-directed) through our virtual school; however, relatively few students elect this option, and it is not a central component of this campus' academic program.

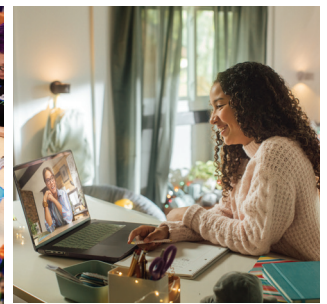
